Ron Fulkerson introduced his guest, Jeremy Powers of Booneville, IN.

President Schlageter commented on some success with the share a ride program amongst our members. Several members have entered their names on the "wanting a ride" list. Many more members are identified as willing to give rides. We can leave it to our own thoughts as to why more do not want a ride.

Associate membership, or mailing membership, status was discussed briefly.

Stories about Oshkosh, 2006 were many this year:

Earl Schroeder read his letter to national EAA about concerns and recommendations to make next year's event even better. Thanks Earl.

Bill Majors made his first flight to Oshkosh in his newly completed RV6A with Eggenfelter Subaru engine. Bill and Larry Helming flew a loose formation flight of two up to Ripon before being separated by ATC. Bill was a sponsor presenter and sent a good bit of his time during the days showing his engine to Subaru prospects. His return flight was slowed by a front of rain and he enjoyed a bite to eat before completing his return.

Larry Helming made his first flight to Oshkosh also. The flight was wonderful until encountering lots of slow flying planes beginning at Ripon. His return flight 4 days later began with a need for careful taxi work and was through some light to moderate rain for about half the trip but visibility was not bad. Although the RV7 is mostly air tight, it seems to have some entry areas for modest amounts of rain.

Pete Wiggins and Les Bryan began as a flight of two but parted ways after a lunch stop due to some sort of difference in the desired speed of their two planes. It seems Les's plane did not desire to maintain a certain range of RPM and speed that was comfortable for Pete's plane. They both arrived without a problem however.

Gary Zimmerman flew with Phil Dawes in the Navion and a Garmin 396, which includes an obstacle avoidance system. The trip up was about 150 extra miles to avoid the obstacles that no one saw but that is good! The return flight on Sat. was a bit more exciting when the 396 decided to quit working. They had to use their fall-back navigation system the Garmin 430 panel mount unit!!

Keith Schlageter says he made one of his poorer landings at Oshkosh. Problem is no one saw it. But he said ATC said something like, "When yellow RV is under control, pull off into the grass." We can only take his word for this. It seems the Navion did not beat him home this trip. The score is 1 to 1.

Mike Zeller spent some time looking at the Mark Landoll engine dampener/balancer. Mike thinks it is a well-built product for under \$500. He sold all the latches he took with him and returned home with more money than he started out with. First time that has happened in a while. Way to go Mike.
